



<u>Logan Township</u> is a township in Gloucester County, New Jersey. As of the 2010 United States Census, the township's population was 6,042. Logan Township is a beautiful community that is situated along the banks of the Delaware River. Within the township's 23 square miles is a unique mixture of residential, farmland, commercial, industrial, and retail areas.

<u>Area Vibes Scores</u> – generally the local towns have a score of 70 or better in terms of the livability.

Transportation

While Logan Township does offer public transportation via buses, the majority of residents use a car as a main form of transportation. The area is 28 miles to Wilmington, Delaware, 32 miles to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and the New Jersey coast (Atlantic City) is 70 miles away.

<u>NJ TRANSIT</u> is New Jersey's public transportation corporation. NJ Transit bus service is available in the township on the 402 route. Download the app to buy and display passes and tickets, plus get transit departure and arrival information.

Philadelphia International Airport (PHL) 32 miles away

Amtrak - <u>Northeast Regional trains</u> The train station in Wilmington, DE has service to New York, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Albany. Amtrak gets you to the heart of the city without the stress and hassles of traffic so you can arrive in better frame of mind and take advantage of all the Northeast has to offer.

Schools

Generally, to register your child for school you will need to have a passport and/or birth certificate, proof of immunizations, any applicable past school records and proof of residency. Most public schools have boundary areas, and you must show proof (i.e. copy of lease or home purchase agreement) to be allowed to register in that particular school. Please always confirm requirements with the school you are interested in before assuming that your child will be able to attend that school.

Grade level in the public school system is determined by the age of the child. Typically, the child must be 5 years old by September 1st to enter kindergarten. School districts may be very strict about the age requirement, but inquire with the school district you are interested in to determine if there are any exemptions for foreign students who are ahead in grade level. You may also want to ask about any gifted or advanced programs as well as their English as a Second Language (ESL) Programs. Some elementary schools also offer a pre-Kindergarten program for children who miss the September 1st requirement. You may inquire at the school districts for availability.

While Wilmington and Philadelphia are about 30 miles away and offer the culture, arts, and entertainment of larger cities, Logan Township has area attractions closer to home.

A select few:

<u>Talen Energy Stadium</u> - 18,500-seat stadium hosts Philadelphia Union soccer games, plus other sports & major concerts. The stadium hosts in summer the Fat Tire "Tour de Fat", a 34 city tour of beer, bikes, bemusement and the American craft beer icon, Fat Tire. Located in Chester, PA across the Commodore Barry Bridge 7 miles from Logan Township, NJ.

<u>Bridgeport Speedway</u> in nearby Swedesboro, NJ, "The Fastest Dirt Track in the East," Bridgeport Speedway lives up to its name. At this venue, you can enjoy live performances from local bands, food and of course stock car races.

<u>Skydiving</u> in nearby Williamstown, NJ - Experience human flight the raw adrenaline of stepping out of an airplane, the thrill of freefall, the freedom of the big sky.

<u>Riverfront Park</u> in Greenwich, NJ - Hike the trails across the grassy areas for viewing of ducks, geese, wading birds, turtles, and other wildlife.







Registration

Obtaining a Driver's License

In the US, a driver's license or ID card is issued by each individual state and not by the federal government. Since there is no national identity card in the USA, and many Americans don't have a passport or carry around a birth certificate, a driver's license issued by your state is often the only official piece of identification for many citizens. Since 9/11, you will need to show a valid driver's license or State ID card to enter many big office buildings.

If you have an out-of-state or out-of-country license, you may use it for as long as you maintain your residency in the state where it was issued. If you are moving permanently to New Jersey, you may use your out-of-state license for only your first two months here. To change to a New Jersey license, bring your Social Security card, another form of ID, and multiple utility or phone bills verifying that you are a New Jersey resident to a motor vehicle facility. You'll have to pass written and eye exams, and usually a road test.
