### **Schools**

Generally, to register your child for school you will need to have a passport and/or birth certificate, proof of immunizations, any applicable past school records and proof of residency. Most public schools have boundary areas, and you must show proof (i.e. copy of lease or home purchase agreement) to be allowed to register in that particular school. Please always confirm requirements with the school you are interested in before assuming that your child will be able to attend that school.

Grade level in the US public-school system is determined by the age of the child. School districts are usually very strict about the age requirement, but inquire with the school district you are interested in to determine if there are any exemptions for foreign students who are ahead in grade level. You may also want to ask about any gifted or advanced programs as well as their English as a Second Language (ESL) Programs. Some elementary schools also offer a pre-Kindergarten program for children who miss the deadline requirement. You may inquire at the school districts for availability, and contact your IOR Destination Services Consultant for more assistance with schooling questions.

#### **Public Schools**

The <u>Jefferson County Public Schools District</u> is home to award-winning and nationally recognized schools that provide a wide range of programs and options including <u>Charter Schools</u> offering <u>IB Programs</u> and <u>STEM Programs</u> to meet the needs and interests of every student. With over 101,000 students in 172 schools and learning centers, more than 80 percent of families in Jefferson County choose the public school system for their children's educational home.

### **Private Schools**

Private schooling is available for students of all levels K-12, such as <u>Louisville's Christian Academy School</u> System and <u>Louisville Collegiate School</u>. Additionally, <u>Sacred Heart Academy</u> offers an IB program.

The options for <u>Catholic education</u> in Louisville are ample with 38 elementary schools enrolling more than 13,700 students, and nine high schools serving a combined 6,000+ students.

There are 101 private schools in Jefferson County, KY, serving 31,634 students.

# Registration

### **Obtaining a Driver's License**

You must surrender any out-of-state license when applying for a license in Kentucky. To obtain an out-of-state transfer, the driver must provide a Social Security card (cannot be laminated) and proof of a Jefferson County address (i.e., deed, property tax bill, lease, utility bill).
