

Transportation

By Car

Most residents have a car for great access to many of New Mexico's scenic highways and byways. Albuquerque is served by "The Big I", the intersection of I40 and I25.

Schools

Generally, to register your child for school you will need to have a passport and/or birth certificate, proof of immunizations, any applicable past school records and proof of residency. Most public schools have boundary areas, and you must show proof (i.e. copy of lease or home purchase agreement) to be allowed to register in that particular school. Please always confirm requirements with the school you are interested in before assuming that your child will be able to attend that school.

Grade level in the US public-school system is determined by the age of the child. School districts are usually very strict about the age requirement, but inquire with the school district you are interested in to determine if there are any exemptions for foreign students who are ahead in grade level. You may also want to ask about any gifted or advanced programs as well as their English as a Second Language (ESL) Programs. Some elementary schools also offer a pre-Kindergarten program for children who miss the deadline requirement. You may inquire at the school districts for availability, and contact your IOR Destination Services Consultant for more assistance with schooling questions.

- <u>Albuquerque Public Schools</u> offer traditional neighborhood schools and Magnet Schools for language immersion, science-based, and International Baccalaureate (IB) Programs.
- 83 private schools in Albuquerque serve 12,556 students.

Albuquerque's creative scene overflows with visual arts, music, dance, film, ethnic, and craft organizations, museums, festivals and associations, but the annual <u>Balloon Fiesta</u> with over 800 hot air balloons is one of Albuquerque's biggest attractions.

Another "don't miss" is the stunning views of the city by taking a ride on the Sandia Peak Aerial Tramway.

The famous Route 66 rolls through Albuquerque, from the volcanoes on the city's far west side through historic Old Town to the trendy Nob Hill area, where you'll find many of the city's best restaurants, shops and boutiques.



The areas surrounding Albuquerque, including Rio Rancho and the East Mountains, provide many unforgettable experiences, such as the <u>Turquoise Trail</u> and <u>Tinkertown Museum</u>.
