





- **Talk a LOT!** Talk to your teacher, your classmates, or the waiter at the restaurant. Take advantage of every opportunity to practice speaking.
- **Repetition.** Try to use what you learn in class right away, and use it regularly.
- **Don't be afraid to make mistakes!** You WILL say things incorrectly in the beginning. It's all part of the learning process!
- **Practice, practice, practice!** You can practice anytime, anywhere. Even if you are not reading, writing, or doing homework, you can make a conscious effort to practice.
 - Practice saying new words out loud
 - Find a Japanese radio station or look for songs on YouTube
 - Try watching a movie in Japanese
 - Go to public events and experience the culture

Most importantly, **HAVE FUN**! Learning a new language opens up many new doors for both professional development and new social experiences. Take advantage of all the opportunities that this will bring your way!
