Odd One Out!



Level: Objectives:

Beginner – Elementary

the student will review the words and their definitions, as well as learn some new words



5-10 minutes

prepare a list of words, where 1 word is odd

- 1. Prepare lists of words (about 4-5 words on each list) and ask the student to guess the odd word. Try to think of unusual ideas.
- 2. Give the student a couple of examples to guess, then get the student to come up with their own ideas (this part could also be given as a home assignment).

Here are some examples:

- \checkmark Apple, peach, banana, tomato, strawberry (a banana does not have seeds)
- ✓ Branch, bowling ball, iceberg, boat (bowling balls do not float)
- ✓ Window, river, envelope, client, oregano ("Client" does not begin and end with the same letter)

Breakdown:

 Comb, champagne, knife, plum (the word "plum" does not contain any silent letters)

NOTE: There can be more than 1 correct answer
