

# Would you rather? (kids'/teenagers' version)



Level:

Intermediate – Advanced



Objectives:

the student will practice answering open-ended questions and supporting their opinions/choices



Timing

10 minutes



Prep/

Materials:

cards with 2 choices

In advance, prepare cards with two choice - the odder, the better. For example, “Would you rather have eyes like a fly’s, or eyes like a spider’s?” If you want to do this without cards, simply give your student two choices and 1-2 minutes to discuss.

Start off the activity with an example. Have the student choose a card and then ask you the question.

You should answer the question and explain why you make this choice. Support your choice with as many details as possible. This will be the example for the student.




Breakdown:

Have the student read the question on the card and ask him to choose 1 out of 2 options and support their choice.

To make the activity more interesting, you can take turns with the student.

Here are some of the things you can ask:

1. Would you rather be a detective or a pilot?
  2. Would you rather go skiing or go to a water park?
  3. Would you rather fly a kite or swing on a swing?
  4. Would you rather dance or sing?
  5. Would you rather be incredibly funny or incredibly smart?
  6. Would you rather become five years older or two years younger?
  7. Would you rather have a full suit of armor or a horse?
  8. Would you rather be a master at drawing or be an amazing singer?
  10. Would you rather be a wizard or a superhero?
