Museum Visit













Prep/ Materials:

Beginner—Intermediate, can be adapted for higher levels

The student will be able to actively listen to an art discussion, practice listening skills with authentic text, recognize spoken words, summarize a discussion, and remember the chronology of a spoken text.

10-15 minutes, can be expanded further into a various levels of difficulty

- Select a short expert commentary, preferably 1-2 minutes long, from a museum website
- Vocabulary list of words associated to art piece
- Prepared 3 or 4 sentences from audio clip
- Audio file of the selected commentary, suggested museum resources:
 - British Museum https://www.britishmuseum.org/visit/audio-guide
 - Available in 10 languages
 - National Gallery of Art https://www.nga.gov/audio-video.html
 - Available in 6 languages
- 1. Introduce art piece and pre-teach art terminology/necessary vocabulary
- 2. Play the audio file of the expert commentary for the student
- 3. Discuss the audio file and discuss new vocabulary words
- 4. Play the audio file, asking the student to focus on the expert's message
- 5. Ask the student to summarize the audio file, discuss the message, and bring up any other notable facts from the audio
- 6. Provide the student with the prepared list of 3 or 4 sentences from the audio clip, the sentences should be listed in random order
- 7. Play the audio file of the expert commentary, asking the student to focus on chronology
- 8. Ask the student to arrange the sentences in the order as listed in the audio
