



STUDY TIPS FOR NORWEGIAN LANGUAGE LEARNERS

Talk a LOT! Talk to your teacher, your classmates, or the waiter at the restaurant. Take advantage of every opportunity to practice speaking.

- **Repetition.** *Try to use what you learn in class right away and use it regularly.*
- **Don't be afraid to make mistakes!** *You WILL say things incorrectly in the beginning. It's all part of the learning process!*
- **Practice, practice, practice!** *You can practice anytime, anywhere. Even if you are not reading, writing, or doing homework, you can make a conscious effort to practice.*
 - *Practice saying new words out loud*
 - *Find a Norwegian radio station or look for songs on YouTube*
 - *Try watching a movie in Norwegian*
 - *Go to public events and experience the culture*

Most importantly, **HAVE FUN!** Learning a new language opens up many new doors for both professional development and new social experiences. Take advantage of all the opportunities that this will bring your way!
