- **Practice, practice!** You can practice anytime, anywhere. Even if you are not reading, writing, or doing homework, you can make a conscious effort to practice.
  - Practice saying new words out loud
  - o Find a Norwegian radio station or look for songs on YouTube
  - Try watching a movie in Norwegian
  - Go to public events and experience the culture
