Summer Visit to a Library





Beginner—Intermediate, can be adapted for higher levels




The student will be able to identify and review resources to develop reading skills at the local library.



Open-ended, can be expanded further into a various levels of difficulty



- Prepare pre-teaching material to discuss the history and purpose of the local library
- Select a vocabulary words associated with a library visit
- Discuss the different literary genres that are found at a library
- Prepare a worksheet, that can be completed during a library visit, for example a scavenger hunt (see attached example)
- Identify the location & hours of a local library
- Make a plan to visit the library with your student or for the student to visit the library on their own



- 2. Pre-teach new vocabulary or specific grammatical targets
- 3. Introduce the different literary genres
- 4. Introduce the scavenger worksheet
- 5. Arrange a visit to the local library



Suggestions for a speaking exercise: The teacher can create a role-play for the student to practice the language they need to open a library card!

Summer Visit to a Library (con't)



LIBRARY SCAVENGER HUNT

Locate magazine section & write down the title of one publication



Ask for a book recommendation



Find out the overdue book policy



Say hello to the librarian



Get a public library card! (if you have one, this is a free space!)



Find a book with an author who has the same last name as yours



Locate music section and write down two names of musicians that are new to you



Learn how to borrow an electronic book



Locate audio books and write down three different formats for audio books
