## **Etiquette Rules from Around the World**





Beginner—Intermediate, can be adapted for higher levels



The student will be able to gain understanding about etiquette by actively watching a short YouTube video clip, observing for contextual clues, learning new vocabulary, and comparing etiquette rules.



- Select a YouTube and pre-watch for your own familiarity Suggested video: <u>12 Unexpected Etiquette Rules from around the world</u>
- Prepare a list of new food terms, new etiquette or grammar phrases
- Prepare a list of yes/no questions based upon the video
- You may change the language setting in the YouTube video to any language you choose, however, choosing a video that discusses etiquette in your specific country may be another great option.



- Introduce as a topic and pre-teach new terms or discuss verbs and verb tenses, review the list of yes/no questions that incorporate the new terms, verbs and verb tenses
- 2. Watch the selected video together to get general understanding of content, (note, you may watch for as little or long as you like, pausing as needed, with or without subtitles, etc. according to level)
- 3. Ask student yes/no questions about the content to check understanding
- 4. Watch the video multiple times, use different subjects to focus upon after each viewing, and discuss using the new vocabulary!

To make it more challenging, compare different rules from various countries
