## Hear, here!





Beginner—Intermediate

The student will be able to identify meanings of homophone pairs and place the words in context.



20-30 minutes

Create a list of 10 homophone pairs:

- Check out these links for examples of homophones in: English, German, Spanish, French and Danish.
- This resource has many other languages & some fun examples of
  homophones in pop culture! <u>Homophones in Many Languages in Context</u>



- 1. Discuss homophones with the student: define what they are and how becoming more familiar with them can aid in listening comprehension.
- 2. Provide the student with your list of 10 homophone pairs. Discuss the list to see if the student can define any of the words just from the spelling.
  - 3. Define any unknown words
  - 4. Work together to come up with a sentence for each homophone word, placing the word in a natural context that shows the meaning. For example:
    - Hear: I can't hear you, could you turn the TV volume down?
    - Here: Knock, knock! I'm here!

Alternate: Play a memory game: write 10 pairs of homophones on 10 pieces of paper, flipped over. Match up each pair & define the words as you go!
