

This or That Board Game

Beginner—Intermediate

The student will be able to speak on random discussion topics and use their creativity while practicing new vocabulary.

15-30 minutes

1. Foam board or large poster board, post-it notes, one die and a game piece (a coin, a bean, etc.). This game can be re-created on a computer using PowerPoint or online [game-board creator](#).
2. Draw large squares on the board in sufficient size to accommodate a post-it note. Write a “this or that” question on a post-it note and place one in each square. Some examples of ‘this or that’ questions are:
 - Cake or Pie? Swimming or Sunbathing? Hi-tech or Low-Tech?
 - New Clothes or New Friends? Rich Friend or Loyal Friend?
 - Sneakers or Sandals?
 - What’s worse: laundry or Dishes?
 - At a movie: Candy or Popcorn?



Breakdown:

1. Have the student roll the die and move the space marker the corresponding number of spaces to land on a post-it note.
2. Have the student answer the question on the post-it note. Make sure to discuss their response & weave in new vocabulary!
3. Take turns with the student and respond to the questions yourself, too! Continue the game until all the post-it notes are gone.
4. To add a new challenge: if either player lands on a blank space, they should come up with a new question off the top of their head!
