- **Verdi:** Tucked along the California border, Verdi feels like a hidden mountain town with easy access to hiking, fishing, and the Truckee River. It offers a slower pace while keeping Reno within easy reach.



Reno continues to be one of the West's **most attractive relocation markets**, offering **more space and value** than many neighboring California cities while maintaining easy access to outdoor recreation. Whether you're looking for a sleek apartment in Midtown, a family-friendly neighborhood in South Reno, or a home with mountain views, there's a wide range of options to fit different lifestyles and budgets.

Apartment renters can expect to pay approximately **\$1,450 to \$2,300+** for a one-bedroom, **\$1,850 to \$3,100+** for a two-bedroom, and **\$2,300 to \$4,500+** for a three-bedroom apartment, depending on the neighborhood and amenities. For those looking to rent a single-family home, three-bedroom properties generally range from **\$2,300 to \$4,500+**, while four-bedroom homes start around **\$2,900 and can exceed \$6,000**. Five-bedroom homes and larger luxury properties can range from **\$3,500 to \$8,500+**.

Pro Tip: South Reno and Damonte Ranch are especially popular for their newer housing, convenient amenities, and easy access to Lake Tahoe and outdoor recreation. When you find the right property, it's worth moving quickly.

Education & Schools



Families moving to Reno have access to **strong public schools** throughout the Washoe County School District, with Damonte Ranch High School, McQueen High School, Galena High School, Reno High School, and Spanish Springs High School consistently among the area's most sought-after campuses.

Private school options are equally impressive, including Sage Ridge School, Bishop Manogue Catholic High School, Brookfield School, Our Lady of the Snows School, and Mountain View Montessori. Families looking for STEM education, gifted programs, or charter schools will also find standout options like Coral Academy of Science and the nationally recognized Davidson Academy located on the **University of Nevada, Reno** campus.
